I started the Psychology Unit Training Clinic singlehandedly in March 2011 in response to need for psychotherapy services following the Egyptian Revolution which started in January 2011 with the approval of former Dean Bruce Ferguson. I have independently continued to develop the clinic since that time. The clinic provides free services to all AUC students, faculty, staff, and AUC alumni. Since its inception it has grown exponentially. We currently have 9 training counselors offering individual, group (including DBT), couples therapy, and outreach to the community. I have consistently supervised the MA Practicum and Internship students who see clients in the clinic and have been the primary on-call faculty Psychologist for the clinic. The clinic works with the Student Counseling Center on campus, which is a separate body with a separate mandate. Since the clinic started in 2011 I have supervised approximately 6,000 hours of direct client contact. Development and management of the clinic has all been done on my own time without compensation or adjustment to my teaching load.
