## Curriculum vitae

Informations and main qualifications

Roberto MEZZINA (Bari, Italy, 03.05.1953) obtained his degree *cum laude* in medicine and surgery from Bari University in 1978, and completed his specialisation in psychiatry in the same University in 1982 (*cum laude*). In 1989 he obtained the national admission to consultant psychiatrist within the first 10 in the list.

Since 1978, he contributed to the experience begun by Franco Basaglia in Trieste (an international forerunner for advanced psychiatric practices for many years and the inspirer of the Italian Mental Health Reform Law, 1978), with the deinstitutionalization of the local psychiatric hospital and the subsequent development of alternative Community Services.

He worked in the Trieste MH Services from September 1979 to September 2019 (retirement).

He became Director of the CMH Centre of Barcola, Trieste in 1998.

He became Deputy Director of the Department of Mental Health in Trieste, Italy from 2007 to 2012, and then **Director of Dept.** till 2019 (retirement).

From 2009 to 2019 he was the **Head of the WHO Collaborating Centre for Research and Training** at the Department of Mental Health, Trieste, which aimed to support the deinstitutionalization and development of community-based services worldwide and in his position he provided technical advice and consultation also to National Governments for reform policies (UK, Denmark, Czech Republic, Australia, New Zealand, Poland, Serbia, France, Palestine among others).

He also co-founder (2001) of the **International Mental Health Collaborating Network**, of whom he is currently the Chair.

In 2019 he has been nominated as **Regional Vice President of the World Federation for Mental Health** (for the Region Europe); in 2021 **Vice President for Programme Development,** member of the Executive Committee of the Federation; in 2023, again **Vice President for Europe**.

He has been invited as teacher, keynote speaker and expert in hundreds of conferences and courses hold by Scientific Institutes, Universities, Mental Health Services in Italy, Europe and overseas (eg. USA, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, India, Sri Lanka, Malaysia, Palestine, Iran, Brazil, Argentina, Chile, Japan, Korea).

He worked as doctor and vaccinator in the vaccination campaign, February-May 2021.

He speaks fluent English and has good informatic skills and competences.

# Prizes and recognitions

He was prized for the Trieste experience as Innovative Practice for "Independent living and participation to the community", as regards to article 19 of CRPD by Zero Project at UN in Vienna, 19 February 2015.

# MAIN AREAS OF INTEREST (1978-2019)

# Leadership and innovation

Over the years it has contributed substantially to the design and implementation of innovative programs of the Trieste DSM, then disseminated nationally and internationally, from those concerning the involvement of users in services, to those of self-help, to those of socio-cultural training, to psychoeducational programs for family members, to crisis intervention programs, to network programs on psychotic onset, to narrative care approaches based on the production of meaning, to innovative residential programs.

He studied and developed the 24-hour CSM model as an integrated service model and a radical alternative to the biological reductionist model of treatment, introducing innovative professionalization and management aspects for the enhancement of human resources.

The CMH Centre he directed (Barcola-Aurisina) represented a community service model constantly visited by Italian and foreign operators, administrators and politicians, and has achieved important results (including the total avoidance of the use of mandatory treatment from June 2003 to August 2006). He has developed in collaboration an operative manual for the 24 hr CMHC.

As Director of Department, he ended up the process of reconversion of all former psychiatric hospital facilities in Trieste toward independent living in 2016; he has opened the first open door forensic unit in Italy in 2015. He also developed a recovery house project (from 2015 on) still operating in the city, with the support of the IMHCN; moreover, he developed an innovative crisis team (2017-2019) bringing together the Italian, British (prof SP Sashidharan), Australian (prof Alan Rosen) and Finnish experience (prof Seikkula's Open Dialogue, that he contributed to introduce in Italy). He promoted the first peer support training course in Italy with ENAIP, and the integration of peers in the Trieste MH services.

# **Experience and areas of competence**

The range of his professional experience and scientific production includes deistitutionalization, organization and management of community services, crisis intervention, integrated approach to the therapy of psychosis, early detection and intervention on first episode of psychosis, community care, rehabilitation, user involvement, qualitative research on recovery, epidemiology, epistemology, quality assurance and critical forensic psychiatry.

He has carried out expert activities as a Technical Consultant at the Civil and Criminal Court of Trieste.

# **Deinstitutionalization practice**

In 1979, he led a group of staff and volunteers in closing one of the last wards of the Trieste mental hospital, which was closed definitively in 1980 (this experience is described in Klaus Hartung's book "Die neue Kleider der Psychiatrie", Berlin, 1980). He had experience of consulting on the closure of PHs in several countries.

# Community mental health practice and clinical work

Appointed as psychiatrist by the Trieste Mental Health Department in 1979, he spent the next 20 years developing community services as a radical alternative to the mental hospital. He has been Director of a comprehensive, 24-hour Community Mental Health Centre, which serves a population of 65,000 and is a sector of the Department of Mental Health of Trieste. He also worked in emergency and crisis care, psychoeducation, rehabilitation, user involvement and community engagement.

## Research

Roberto Mezzina has dedicated much time to a host of wide-ranging research activities in the area of community mental health. For example, in 1987, he carried out an international research on the opinions and attitudes of clinicians and users concerning community care in Italy, Chile and the UK (in collaboration with the University of Birmingham).

In 1996, he has directed a multi-site research on community crisis intervention, as part of the National Project for Mental Health of the Istituto Superiore di Sanità (Ministry of Health). The outcomes have been published on a book in Italian: "Crisi psichiatrica e sistemi sanitari", 2005.

He was involved in two international research groups on recovery from severe mental disorders with colleagues from USA, Sweden, Norway (IRRG, issued on the AJPR, 2005) and Australia (see the monograph with articles issued by the AJPR, 2005-2006).

He has collaborated with the Mario Negri Institute of Research in Italy for the study on First Cases of Psychosis (from 1994).

He also contributed to the Optimal Treatment of Psychosis Project, run by Dr Ian Falloon (Bonn 1997, Hamburg 1998, Trieste 1998).

He developed innovative and original instruments of evaluation for crisis intervention and recently for the assessment of the social enterprises (SENTER.RATE).

He also contributed to the evaluation of instruments for a research on Social Network in Psychosis, led by Mario Negri Institute in Italy (SIRS, from 2006).

He also collaborated for the development of the questionnaires with the national research "Progresacuti", in collaboration with the Istituto Superiore di Sanità, financed by Italian Minister of Health.

In 2007-2009 he was in the Steering Committee of the European Research DEMOBinC, with 11 countries, led by prof Helen Killaspy (UCL), officially financed by EU Public Health fund, attending meeting in London (2007), Trieste, Wroclaw and Prague (2008), Athens (2009), and Brussels (2010). The QuIRC tool "Quality Indicators for Rehabilitative Care" has been developed by the group. The instrument is available and can be operated online.

He has been the scientific coordinator of the research financed by Italian Minister of Health on Job Placement in the Mental Health Departments (PIL DSM).

He designed and conducted a research on the use of Antipsychotics in the MH Dept. Of Trieste (2007-2010), published.

He has collaborated at the international research on: "Psychiatric outpatient care in the Netherlands which lessons learned from Trieste?" Trimbos Instituut, Utrecht, 2014-2015. The research issued the book by Christien Muusse and Sonja van Rooijen "Freedom First - A study of the experiences with community-based mental healthcare in Trieste, Italy, and its significance for the Netherlands".

The Centre was based at the Department of mental health, Azienda Sanitaria Universitaria Integrata di Trieste (ASUITS), which has now merged into the ASUGI (Azienda Sanitaria Universitaria Giuliano-Isontina). It was launched in 1987 as a Regional Centre of excellence. In 2005 it has been nominated as Lead Collaborating Centre by WHO for Service development by WHO Euro.

The WHO CC has developed collaborations in about 30 European countries, particularly with pilot experiences of reform in Central-Asian Republics, Turkey, Central and Eastern European countries (Bulgaria, Romania, Czech Republic, Slovenia, Hungary), the Balkan region (Albania, Macedonia, Bosnia, Montenegro, Greece, Serbia, where "The EUROStart Programme of Cooperation" between Region FVG and autonomous Province of Vojvodina identified and supported 4 pilot sites and in connection with OPEN ARMS European Project for D.I. of Social Institutions).

## Argentina

"IntegrAr", a Project of Cooperation for training in MH Services and Social Enterprises in Argentina, with the WHOCC and other NGOs as partners, has been funded by the Region Friuli. WHOCC Trieste supports the development of reform processes in South America through Latin America networks. The WHO CC has been partner in the project "IntegrAr", a Cooperation Project for training in MH Services and Social Enterprises in Argentina. The project funded by the Region Friuli starded in February 2016 and was closed on 15th October 2017. Due to the importance on the IntegAr project a new project has been presented and funded by the Region FVG. The new project titled "Por un pais sin manicomios" started October 2018 and will be closed on April 2020. The WHOCC is partner of the project that has been implemented with the cooperation of the Argentinian Government. Partners of the project were: Dirección Nacional de Salud Mental y Adicciones, Órgano de Revisión de la ley de Salud Mental- Defensoría General de la Nación, WFMH – World Federation for Mental Health and Consortium of Co-ops (COSM) of Region Friuli Venezia Giulia. The aim of the Project is to promote social cohesion and inclusion through a plan of

interventions to guarantee human rights and support the implementation of the deinstitutionalisation policies envisaged by the Law of Mental Health Reform n.26657. The WHO QualityRights has been introduced as a main toolkit by the Dirección Nacional de Salud Mental y Adicciones of Argentinian Government.

In this framework WHO.CC staff went twice to Argentina on November 2018 and on May 2019. The delegation visited the provinces of La Rioja and Ente Rios, with site visits and meetings with local authorities. On 24th May during the meeting "Tinkunako por la salud mental", Dr Devora Kestel interviewed with a Skype connection from WHO HQ.

After the two missions in Argentina Skype meetings were scheduled to continue the supervision on next steps. In April 2019 a delegation of representatives of the Ministry of Health spent 10 days in Trieste for a depth insight of Trieste MH Services and social integration strategies.

An increasing number of Trainee Psychiatrist and Psychologist coming from Argentina are undertaking some months (from 3 to 6 months) of Training in Trieste in order to learn and then applicate Trieste approach based onhuman rights in Argentina.

A large delegation of Argentinian stakeholders will participate to the International meeting "Good Practice Services: promoting human rights and recovery in mental health" where a special parallel session will be organized for an overwiew on Latin America.

Ms Kerry Morrison, involved in the twinning collaboration as project mamager of the opening of a Trieste model CMHC in Los Angeles, spent a month of training and deeping in Trieste to better know Trieste MH System and how to apply in in the Los Angeles area.

A large delegation (39 people) made of policy makers, stakeholders and journalist from California and Los Angeles area participated to the International meeting "Good Practice Services: promoting human rights and recovery in mental health".

## **Palestine**

An agreement has been developed between WHOCC and AICS (Italian governament agency for international development cooperation) for the development of 36months project titled "Mental Healthcare and psychosocial rehabilitation" in the framework of the Ring Project. The new programme is intended to improve rehabilitation within the stepped care model, and interacting with Primary Care level also through mhGap Intervention Guide.
